- identify the signs and symptoms of asphyxia and carry out effective treatment for a choking casualty
- recognize an unconscious casualty and treat including treatment for a seizure
- demonstrate effective CPR skills
- demonstrate a thorough top to toe survey and be able to turn the casualty into the recovery position
